

FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Welcome to our school! Oregon Connections Academy (ORCA) served approximately 4,100 students in the 2015-2016 school year. Over half of students enrolled in grades K-12 were new to ORCA for last year.

Oregon Connections Academy consistently outperforms schools of similar demographics. Although the state has suspended the assignment of school ratings during the transition from OAKS to Smarter Balanced, we are particularly proud that our state test scores in English Language Arts have remained above the state averages. Including all tested grade levels, ORCA significantly outperformed the state in English Language Arts and was within 5 percentage points of the state average in Science.

We are also proud of our success in increasing ORCA's graduation rate which has increased by nearly 15 percentage points over the last three years, including a 5 percentage point increase during the past school year. We expect additional growth this year with our continued focus on student success measures, such as graduation rate and course completion. We also are very proud of the college credits earned by ORCA students through our College Now program. 403 students have earned college credit at ORCA over the years by taking at least one of our 19 high school courses that qualify for dual credit.

Oregon Connections Academy students were awarded \$558,275 of scholarships upon graduation!

We promise to continue to deliver the same excellence you have come to expect from us as we move into our 12th year of operation. Your involvement as a Learning Coach is key to your students' success, which includes providing input on our annual parent survey. Last year's survey showed that 97% of ORCA parents are satisfied with teacher helpfulness and 95% of parents believe that the curriculum is high quality.

Parents gave high marks for our academic rigor, program flexibility, the high quality of our teachers, and for delivering high levels of student achievement. We encourage you to support our ongoing improvement efforts by using the feedback channels we provide to let us know how we are doing.

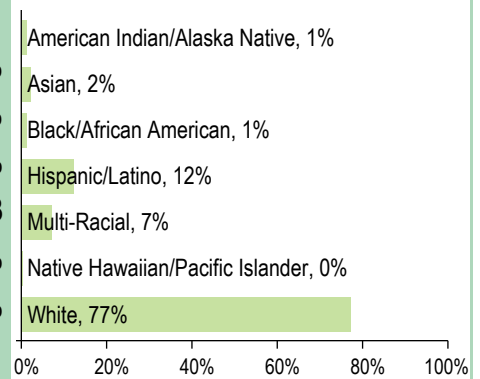

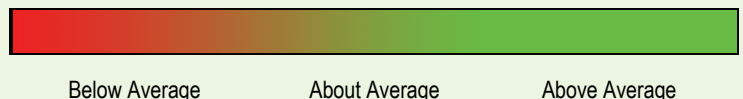
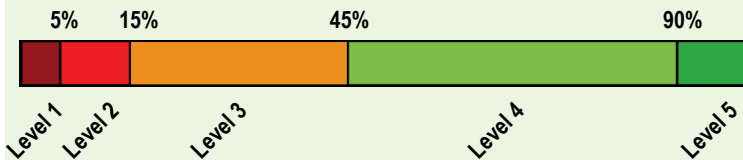
